MPP is working for compassion and common sense.

People fighting cancer, AIDS, MS, and other serious illnesses shouldn't have to suffer when medical marijuana can provide relief.

MPP's Major Accomplishments

- **Medical marijuana patients and caregivers no longer fear arrest in Rhode Island, Hawaii, and Vermont** because MPP successfully drafted and gained passage of medical marijuana laws through these states' legislatures.
- **Medical marijuana patients in Michigan and Montana are protected** because the states' voters overwhelmingly passed MPP's medical marijuana initiatives.
- **Small-time marijuana possession in Massachusetts is punishable just by a \$100 fine** because the state's voters passed MPP's decriminalization initiative.
- **Medical marijuana patients in Maryland are no longer subject to imprisonment** because MPP persuaded the Republican governor to sign its medical marijuana bill.
- **Two states are getting close to ending marijuana prohibition entirely**, as MPP's ballot initiatives to tax and regulate marijuana like alcohol twice garnered the all-time biggest votes in the history of the country — 44% in both Alaska and Nevada.
- **Approximately 1.5 million Californians live in municipalities where adult marijuana offenses are the lowest priority** for local law enforcement because MPP's grants program provided almost all of the funding to pass local ordinances through four ballot initiatives in Oakland, Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz, and Santa Monica, and through the city councils of West Hollywood and San Francisco.
- **The National Academy of Sciences recognizes marijuana's medical value** due in large part to MPP's efforts to provide patient and physician perspectives to the Institute of Medicine, which issued its landmark report favorable for medical marijuana.
- **MPP has debated White House officials and other prohibitionists** on national TV and radio and on the pages of almost every newspaper in the country. MPP's projects have been featured on the cover of *Time* magazine; in articles in *The New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *The Washington Post*, *USA Today*, the Associated Press, and Reuters; and in appearances on National Public Radio; NBC's "The Today Show"; CNN's "American Morning," "Crossfire," "Headline News," and "Lou Dobbs Tonight"; FOX News' "The O'Reilly Factor"; CNBC's "On the Money"; PBS's "NewsHour with Jim Lehrer"; and Comedy Central's "The Colbert Report."

THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE use marijuana as part of their treatment for cancer, AIDS, multiple sclerosis, chronic pain, epilepsy, and other serious illnesses.

Unfortunately, the federal government currently gives only four patients legal permission to use marijuana, through a federal program that was closed to all new applicants in 1992.

Although 13 states have passed laws protecting medical marijuana patients from arrest and jail, medical marijuana remains illegal under federal law.

To truly solve this problem, our nation's federal policies must be changed. If you're a medical marijuana patient—or a friend or family member of a patient—MPP needs your help. We can't change the laws without working with patients themselves.

MPP is the largest marijuana policy reform organization in the United States.

MPP's projects include:

- ✓ encouraging major health and medical associations to take favorable positions on medical marijuana;
- ✓ urging federal agencies to clear the way for FDA approval of marijuana as a prescription medicine;

- ✓ lobbying state legislatures to pass legislation to protect marijuana-using patients from arrest;
- ✓ helping activists to build support for other medical marijuana bills in their home states; and
- ✓ building support for medical marijuana legislation in the U.S. Congress.
